# Governor Welcomes Vantec to Falls City

Iowa-based <u>Vantec, Inc.</u> announced in May it will be expanding its manufacturing operations into Falls City. The custom plastics injection molding company will locate in the 40,000 sq. ft. spec. industrial building and will employ over 25 people with plans to expand operations and employment in the future. The total project investment is \$4.4 million. The company anticipates the plant will be operational by November of this year.

Vantec serves many different Original Equipment Manufacturers located throughout the United States and abroad. Company principals Willie and Bev Van Wyhe (photographed above with Gov. Heineman) have grown the company into a total manufacturing partner by providing assistance with

product development and engineering to ensure complete customer satisfaction.

Vantec chose Falls City after an extensive site search to better serve the needs of a major customer in the region and to take advantage of a readily available labor pool.

"We are excited to be able to employ more people and help take on more opportunities with our customers, and potential customers," said the Van Wyhes in the company's press announcement.

The announcement was attended by over 150 people including the Governor, Senator Heidemann and Nebraska Department of Economic Development Director Richard Baier and Business Consultant Phil Michels.





At this year's Heartland Economic Development Training Course held in Kansas City each of the 85 participating organizations' websites were evaluated by course instructors. The Falls City EDGE website was recognized as one of the best. According to Chuck Whitney who attended the course, "The EDGE website was cited as a model based on its content, ease of navigation and visual appeal."

The importance of our internet presence in marketing Falls City development opportunities cannot be understated. Development Counsellors International, leading place branding and marketing consultants, recently released the results of their 2008 "Winning Strategies in Economic Development Marketing" survey of senior corporate executives. Similar surveys were conducted by DCI in 1996, 1999, 2002 and 2005.

# EDGE Website Recognized

Internet presence rated highest among economic development tools in national survey of corporate executives

One of the survey questions asked respondents to rate the effectiveness of seven typical marketing techniques—advertising, direct mail, hosting special events, internet/web, planned visits to corporate executives, public relations/publicity, and telemarketing by economic development organizations. "Internet/website" advanced dramatically in the 2008 survey to capture the highest rating among all economic development marketing tools, pointing to how essential a strong internet presence is.

Sixty-four percent of the respondents indicated a strong likelihood that they would use an economic development organization's web site in their next site location search. The executives named "information on available incentives" and demographic information" as the most useful features.

Since its launch in February 2007, the EDGE website has received a total of 204,154 hits, 39,449 page views and 13,499 unique visitors. The website is updated frequently. #### Nebraska Super Advantage Passes

The second session of the 100<sup>th</sup> Nebraska Legislature was a busy one. Despite a full plate, the 49 state legislators found time to positively impact Nebraska's business and tax climate. The Governor was determined to pursue a more favorable tax climate to

enhance economic development efforts. Because of that, Senator Ray Janssen introduced LB 895 on the Governor's behalf. The bill, named the Nebraska Super Advantage, expanded the state's already successful Nebraska Advantage Act (2005) to include innovative incentives that encourage companies to create high paying jobs or to invest heavily in the state. Businesses will qualify for the Super Advantage if they invest \$10 million while creating 75 jobs paying either 200% of the county average wage or 150% of the state average wage, whichever is greater. Businesses will also qualify with a \$100 million capital investment if they create 50 jobs at the above thresholds. In return for a company's investment and job creation, they would receive a 15% investment credit, 10% wage credit, tangible personal property exemption for 10 years, and a sales tax refund on all capital purchases. In addition, the company may use their credits to offset their real property taxes at the site of the project as well as apply them to sales tax, income tax, and employee withholding. The entitlement period is 10 years for these benefits as opposed to the next highest entitlement period at 7 years.



One activity received special attention in LB 895 as legislators added web-portal businesses as eligible business activities in tiers 2-6. They also added an exemption of personal property tax on computer systems for the investment only Tier 5. High-tech jobs are important for 21st century success. These changes will put Nebraska on the leading edge to attract companies offering these services. With all of these incentives on top of Nebraska's world class workforce, high quality and low cost living and central location, Nebraska is primed for success in every aspect of the economy.

In addition to the Super Tier within LB 895, other programs were augmented to expand opportunity for businesses throughout the state. The Nebraska Rural Advantage received more money for 2009, and more businesses will be eligible applicants. Effective July 1, 2009, a qualifying business in any village can apply for Rural Tier 1. Qualifying businesses in any second-class city in the state can apply for Rural Tier 2. Senators also placed language within the Rural Advantage that extends incentives to businesses in Omaha located in "any area consisting of one or more contiguous census tracts, which contain a percentage of persons below the poverty line of greater than 30 percent." This will mean greater competition for incentives in this tier and growth for more communities throughout the state.
